

STALLION SERVICE RULES

1. All donated stallion services will be sold at half price on a first come, basis unless a stallion owner selects the buyer and no service will sell less than \$300.00.
2. The sale of a stallion service entitles both the stallion owner and the mare owner an entry into the closed and open classes.
3. In November a packet will be sent to those who purchased and those who donated a stallion service that sold on the rules of the futurity.
4. Buy ins will be allowed into the closed class provided the stallion they bred their mare to, was sold in the stallion service sale. If you want to buy in to the closed class you must nominate your mare before January 1st. The fee to buy into this class is \$150.00 made in two payments of \$75.00 on March 15th and \$75.00 dollars by June 15th. If you want into the open class you must follow the rules for the open class.
5. Stallion owners who donate their stallion's service and it does not sell by July 1st, must purchase the stallion's service between July 1st and October 31st. Price of stud fee: \$225 for 1 foal to be shown in open and closed classes; ½ of regular fee or \$300, whichever is greater, for 2 foals to be shown in open and closed classes.
6. The sold services will be put into the open and closed class list when it is printed in the first newsletter of nominations..
7. There will be \$75.00 taken from the stallion fund for each foal that is eligible to pay for their open class.
8. If a mare doesn't settle the first year, the mare owner should contact the stallion owner and let him know of this situation. It is the mare owners obligation to do this. It is also the obligation of the mare owner to notify the stallion service chairman so that money can be held back to the next year. If the purchased stallion service isn't used within the two years, the purchased service will not be eligible to a free entry to either the open or closed futurity after 2005.
9. If you purchase a stallion service and decided for one reason or the other that you don't want to breed to this stallion there isn't any refund nor changing of stallions. The mare owner can sell this service he or she has purchased but must notify the stallion chairman of this.
10. If a stallion owner doesn't have a foal from one of his mares to show he may pick a foal that his stallion sired to be his entry, but must have a lease agreement from the mare owner on file with the stallion service chairman.

PAYOUTS:

1. If less than 5 stallion services sell the stallion service will pay to three places for mare owners and stallion owners.
2. If more than 5 stallion services sell in the stallion sale then the purse will go to 5 places for the mare owner and the stallion owners
